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Instrumental Music in 2019

At Graceville State School, weekly tuition is provided by specialist instrumental music teachers on a range of musical instruments. The instrumental music program is currently entering a recruitment period where students from years 2 and 3 can apply for a place in the program for 2019. Please note, places are limited due to the staffing allocation of instrumental music teachers to the school.

Current year 2 and 3 students will undergo the recruitment process this semester, ready to commence learning an instrument in term 1 2019 (if they are offered a place). Selected students in year 3 (in 2019) are able to play the violin, viola or cello and students in year 4 (in 2019) are able to play the cello, double bass, or a band instrument (brass, percussion and woodwind instruments).

Please note that only a small number of students will be able to join the instrumental program when they are in year 3 in 2019. Students who are interested in the string program should apply in year 2 but can apply again in year 3 if they are not successful. Students interested in the band program should apply during the recruitment period when they are in year 3.

It is the policy at Graceville State School to lease an instrument to students for one year, after which time the family will be required to purchase an instrument (or families may choose to purchase an instrument for 2019). Students who join the percussion program do not hire an instrument, they need to purchase a glockenspiel, drum pads, sticks and a tutor book. They also pay a fee each year of \$50 for maintenance of school instruments used in lessons/rehearsals.

Many important points (included in the inset above) need to be considered by parents and teachers before allowing a child to take on the responsibility of a position in the instrumental music program as a significant commitment is required from students. There is also an extensive assessment process to determine suitability before places are allocated. 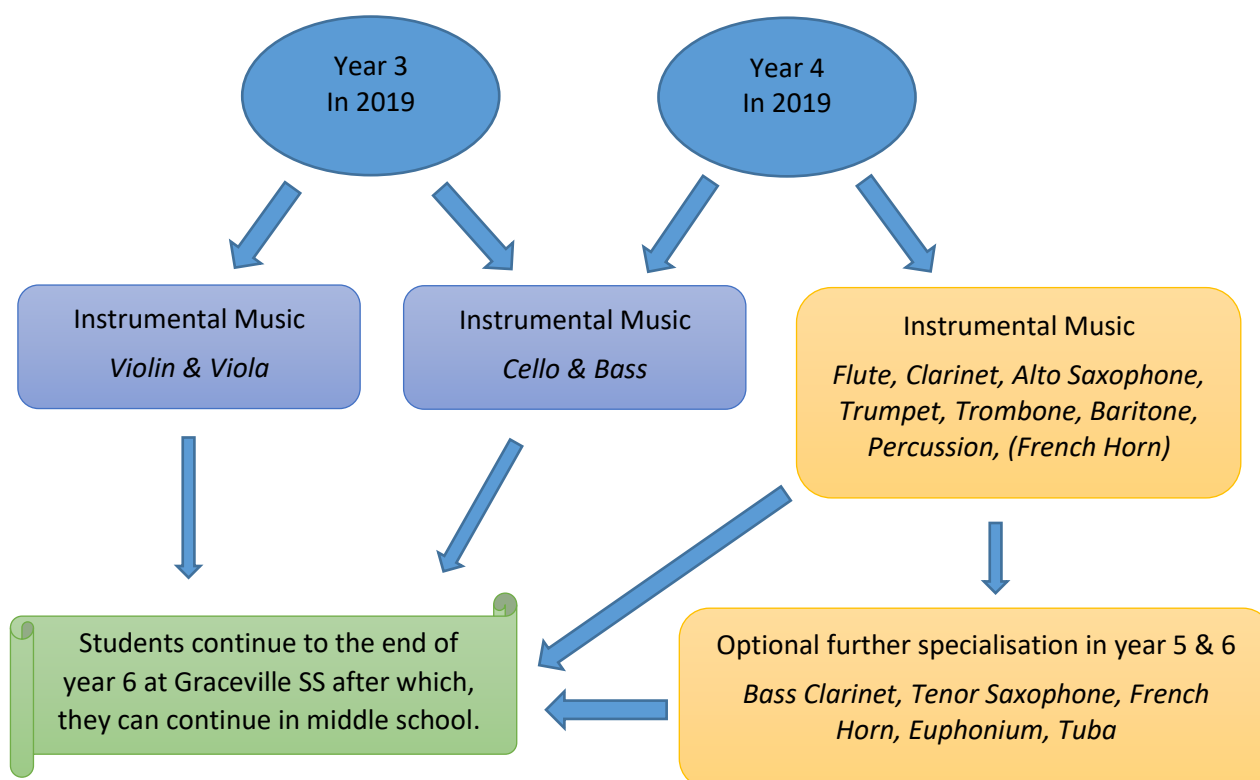

The Commitment Required

- Ensemble rehearsals before /after school/during breaks
- Group music lessons in school time once a week
- Performances in and out of school time
- Practicing music at home
- Bringing all musical equipment to school for lessons and rehearsals
- Continuing in the program until the end of year 6
- Purchasing an instrument after one year (with exemptions for expensive instruments)
- Provide funds for the instrumental music levy, workshop and other program costs such as a tutor book and music consumables.

Further Information

You child need not have any prior musical experience to apply to join the music program. All the skills and musical literacy required to be successful will be taught while participating in the program. Each successful student can only access lessons on one instrument. Instrument selection is an important consideration as swapping or changing instruments is not permitted. **Students cannot join the string program in year 3 and then transfer to the band program in year 4. Students are also not able to swap from one instrument to another within the string or band program.**

All successful applicants will be notified by letter. This letter will indicate whether or not it will be necessary to purchase a musical instrument and will outline other purchase requirement to enroll in the program. Before purchasing any music instrument it is recommended that you discuss the purchase with the instrumental teacher.
