

# Clowning Around for Chaplaincy

Clowning Around for Chaplaincy is a 10 day school event which sees classes having fun with their teachers while trying to raise money for Chaplaincy. Each class will work with their teacher to create a plan of how they will celebrate over the 10 day period. The class will decide on the fundraising milestones for their class, with fun activities built in to celebrate at those junctures. Some examples of the fun activities from 2014 are: the class being allowed to wear coloured shoe laces or socks one day, having their teacher or whole class dress up like a clown. It is important to note, this is a class, not individual fundraiser. The winning classes of the pool party in junior and senior school will be announced and Mrs Smith and other members of staff may even have their faces painted!
